



Arts and Crafts Volunteer

This volunteer role helps with art and craft projects that support the trans and non-binary community.

It's a hands-on role that assists with projects like decorating our Pride Parade float, screen printing t-shirts, and other arty projects that pop up throughout the year. This role is suitable for people with limited experience in craft activities – all levels of experience welcome. You don't need to be arty to volunteer! We just need willing hands to help out.

What you'll be doing:

- Assisting with arts and crafts projects (e.g. Decorating a Parade Float)
- Following instructions
- Collaborating with other volunteers
- Other tasks as needed

Other tasks might include:

- Brainstorming ideas for projects
- Planning a project
- Helping source supplies

Skills, experience and qualities needed:

- Teamwork and collaborative skills
- Good communication skills
- People skills such as: friendliness, open mindedness, willingness to 'listen' to what someone is saying
- Accepting and understanding of trans and non-binary people's experiences
- Experience with arts and crafts isn't required (but if you do have experience that is fantastic!)

Time Commitment:

Time commitment for this role changes throughout the year depending on if an event or project is on.

This role needs a minimum commitment of 3 hours a month with more time likely required in the lead up to November (Pride Month) and March (Trans Day of Visibility is on March 31st).

Other information:

You will need:

- A device with internet access (e.g. a computer or phone) – this is for engaging with the TransFolk team.
- Ability to travel to a location for volunteering in the Perth Metro area.

Support Offered:

There will be simple and clear instructions for how to complete craft activities with the supervision of a crafty team leader.



You'll receive an induction into volunteering with TransFolk of WA. The Volunteering Coordinator or a supervisor will be the point of contact re volunteering responsibilities and commitments.

Benefits of the role:

- Building connection, networks and friendship with other volunteers who are also passionate about supporting the trans community
- Opportunity to undertake TransFolk of WA trainings
- Opportunity to learn from others doing volunteering
- You might learn some new arts and crafts skills!

What to do if you're interested:

The form will ask for:

- Your contact details
- How you identify (as a peer organisation this is relevant)
- A paragraph outlining why you're interested in the role
